



# RS passes Bill to protect city's unauthorised colonies

Upper House of Parliament clears legislation to replace ordinance providing protection to such developments from punitive action

THE Rajya Sabha on Tuesday passed the National Capital Territory of Delhi Laws (Special Provisions) Second (Amendment) Bill, 2021 to regularise unauthorised colonies in Delhi. The bill replaces the National Capital Territory of Delhi Laws (Special Provi-

sions) Second (Amendment) Ordinance, 2020 which was promulgated by President Ram Nath Kovind on December 30, 2020 to extend the validity of the act of 2011 for a period of three years from January 1, 2021 to December 31, 2023.

"1.35 crore people of Delhi, those living in unauthorised colonies, will get their ownership right," Minister of State

(Independent Charge) of Housing and Urban Affairs Hardeep Singh Puri said in Rajya Sabha. The bill provides protection to certain forms of unauthorised developments in Delhi from punitive action where adequate measures are yet to be

taken. The minister said that tenders have been floated for the *Jahan Shuggi Wahan Makaan* scheme.

"Delhi will not only benefit from the improvement in living conditions of 1.35 crore people but the Central Vista

project will also make Delhi one of the finest cities in the world," Puri said. The minister said that the number of 1.35 crore is expected in the next census later this year.

Aam Aadmi Party MP Sanjay Singh said that 40 lakh people live in slums. He said that the government had promised last year that people in unauthorised colonies will be given

ownership rights and demanded that it should be executed now. Taking part in the debate, Congress leader K T S Tulsi said over 30 per cent of Delhi population lives in slums or unauthorised colonies and asked the government if it would make an effort to find a solution to this problem and provide a life of dignity.

## TUSSLE AAP slams SDMC for toilet charge

THE Aam Aadmi Party on Tuesday has opposed the move of the South Municipal Corporation of Delhi to charge ₹5 for use of public toilets saying it is going to hurt a lot of poor people and should be withdrawn.

Leader of Opposition in South Delhi Municipal Corporation, Prem Chauhan said that BJP's decision to charge a fee for using the MCD toilets will also fail the 'Swachh Bharat' mission across the capital.

AAP members also held a protest at Mohan Singh Market area in RK Puram area of Delhi along with slum dwellers in the vicinity, against the BJP ruled civic body's decision.

"The Aam Aadmi Party completely opposes this anti-poor decision of the Bharatiya Janata Party. Firstly, the conditions of MCD toilets are miserable and secondly, now the BJP is charging extra money for it. How will the BJP run the 'Swachh Bharat Abhiyan' with such a decision? Now, these people will be forced to stop using public toilets," said Chauhan.

Party's MCD in-charge Durgesh Pathak also said that the BJP ruled MCD has decided to impose Rs five per use for the toilets under their jurisdiction, this decision will devastate the lives of slum dwellers.

"Under the influence of the anti-poor mindset, the BJP ruled MCD has come up with a proposal that now any citizen will use the toilets under the jurisdiction of the BJP ruled MCD will have to pay Rs 5 per use" said Pathak.



## Capital sees best vaccination turnout

OVER 12,700 beneficiaries received the Covid-19 vaccine shots in Delhi on Tuesday in the fourth week of the inoculation drive, the highest single-day turnout by numbers till date, officials said. The turnout was over 70 per cent, a marked improvement from the figures a day before - 9,740 (54 per cent turnout).

Besides healthcare workers, frontline workers- including police, civil and defence staff, and DJB and electricity department employees, among others- are also getting jabs since the last couple of days.

According to officials, more number of frontline workers are coming ahead to receive the vaccine compared to healthcare workers. Also, the number of scheduled days, from initially being four days - Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday - has now been extended to six days a week,

### OVER 12K GET THE SHOT



Delhi Police Commissioner S N Shrivastava on Tuesday got vaccinated against Covid-19, officials said. He got the jab at the Primus Super Speciality Hospital in Chanakyapuri



Monday-Saturday. After a sluggish start, since the exercise was kicked off on January 16, the inoculation drive picked up pace in the past few days.

The targeted number for vaccination on February 9 was 15,100, officials said.

"Today, 12,717 people were administered the coronavirus vaccine, and AEFI (adverse events following immunisation) was reported in seven

persons. This is the highest number (of people vaccinated) achieved in a day so far," a senior official of the Delhi Health Department said.

The number of people vaccinated against COVID-19 till date in Delhi, majority of them being healthcare workers, had crossed the one lakh-mark a few days ago.

As per officials, district magistrates (DMs) of several districts have come forward to

vaccinate themselves and set an example. The DMs of South West, North, West, North West, North East districts and others have got the vaccines.

The number of people vaccinated till date in Delhi, majority of them being healthcare workers, had crossed the one lakh-mark a few days ago. No fresh Covid-19 death was recorded in the national capital on Tuesday while 100 fresh cases were registered.

## Delhi Police acted impartially, swiftly during riots, Centre tells Lok Sabha

THE Delhi police used "appropriate force" and took "proportionate action" in the Delhi riots cases, the government said on Tuesday.

The union ministry of home affairs was asked if it had taken cognisance of videographic footage that allegedly showed police using excessive force in some cases while, in some other instances, failing to do its duty by silently observing the violence instead of intervening to stop rioting mobs.

"During the Northeast Delhi riots, Delhi Police acted swiftly in an impartial and fair manner. Proportionate and appropriate actions were taken by Delhi Police to control the situation," Union Minister of State for Home Affairs G Kishan Reddy told the Lok Sabha. He was answering questions posed

by Congress MP Mohammad Jawed who also asked whether the government intends to investigate the actions of the police during the riots that took place in February last year.

The minister, in his reply, lauded the police for controlling riots. "Sincere, dedicated and incessant efforts made by Delhi Police brought the riotous situation to normalcy within a short span of time and also prevented the riots from spreading across to other areas," he said.

Reddy added that the police used appropriate force to control and disperse the crowd. "Necessary legal and preventive actions were taken by Del-

hi Police on all complaints/calls received, as per law and procedure," Reddy said, in a written reply.

Delhi Police's role during the riots has been criticised by many, including the Delhi Minorities Commission, which went on to allege that police even participated in the violence in some areas and that there was deliberate inaction on the part of the cops. In a fact-finding report released in July last year, the minorities panel suggested that the "failure to prevent communal violence was not due to individual or sporadic breaches, but was a pattern of deliberate inaction over several days."

## Bird flu found in droppings taken from zoo

NEW DELHI: Four serological samples of bird droppings collected from Delhi zoo have been found positive for the Avian influenza virus.

The National Zoological Park in the capital said the samples found positive for the virus were collected from four different points at the zoo and sent to the National Institute of High Security Animal Diseases (NIHSAB), Bhopal, by the Animal Husbandry Department of Delhi on February 3.

In an official statement, the National Zoological Park said all safety measures are being taken and the zoo shall continue to remain closed.

"All safety measures and protocols of Central Zoo Authority (CZA), Ministry of Environment and AHD, Delhi government, related to avian influenza are strictly being adhered to and constant monitoring is being done by the field staff and a team of veterinarians in the zoo," it said.

"Birds in captivity and free ranging birds are behaving normal as per reports and all possible prophylactic measures and drills related to disinfection are regularly being taken," the Delhi zoo said.

## Gambhir opens Delhi's second Jan RasoI in New Ashok Nagar

BJP MP and cricketer-turned-politician Gautam Gambhir on Tuesday opened a second 'Jan RasoI', a private canteen to feed the poor and needy in the city, in New Ashok Nagar area of his parliamentary constituency.

The food at the canteen is available at subsidised rate with a basic meal at the cost of ₹1. BJP national vice-president and Delhi in-charge Baijayant Panda inaugurated the canteen in presence of Delhi BJP chief Adesh Gupta.

The first 'Jan RasoI' was opened in Gandhi Nagar in December last year, where around 1,000 people are served

food every day. Gambhir said that the 'Jan RasoI' is not just a kitchen but a movement. "A movement to feed those in need, a movement to end hunger... Food is the most basic necessity and even in the national capital people are unable to get two square meals a day," he said.

Attacking Arvind Kejriwal, he said that the CM had promised hundreds of subsidised canteens for the poor but it was only for advertisements. "Nothing is there on the ground. I have not entered politics to compete in drama and dharnas but to bring real change and that is what I am doing," the MP from East Delhi said.
