

# City records highest single-day rise in Covid-19 cases

Indore

Despite the city's night curfew for the past few days and a weekend lockdown, the new Covid-19 cases have been continuously on the rise. Breaking the previous record, 628 new coronavirus positive cases were found on Monday out of 3,751 samples tested.

The rate of positive cases stood at 16.74 percent. With 628 new Covid-19 cases, the total number of positive patients recorded in the city so far since the outbreak of the pandemic has risen to 69,028. In the last five days, a staggering 3,071 new Covid-19 patients have been reported from the city, taking the tally of its active patients to 3,545. Two deaths were also reported on Monday, taking the total death toll due to the coronavirus in the city to 967.

According to the chief medical and health officer, 9,23,156 samples have been tested in the city until Monday. Of 3,751 samples tested on Monday, as many as 3,113 tested negative. The health department took 3,761 more samples for testing including 3,501 for RT-PCR tests and 260 for Rapid Antigen Tests.

Of the new Covid-19 cases, a maximum of 15 patients have been reported from the Khajrana area, followed by 14 from Vishnupuri Annexe, 13 in Musakhedi, 11 each from Sudama Nagar and Silicon City, nine in Vijay Nagar, eight patients each from Tilak Nagar, Nanda Nagar, Snehalatganj, Sukhalia, Shiv Shakti Nagar, Kalani Nagar, and Mahalaxmi Nagar, and seven patients each from Palasia, Sukhdev Nagar and Nipania.

## Day-care centre for low-risk patients, ward-level vaccine points in city

A day-care center will be started in the city to take care of low-risk, asymptomatic patients without comorbidities in the city.

A review meeting on the Covid-19 situation in the Indore division on Tuesday also decided to start ward-level free vaccination centers to ease pressure on hospitals.

The meeting chaired by Divisional Commissioner Pawan Kumar Sharma was attended by Dr Sanjay Dixit, Dean of Medical College, Indore, and superintendents of the government hospitals and heads of department in the commissioner's office. Indore Collector Manish Singh, Indore Development Authority CEO Vivek Shrotriya, Deputy Commissioner Sapna Solanki, and Joint Director Health Dr Ashok Dagaria were also present.

Sharma reviewed the availability of ventilators, oxygen beds, and manpower and other necessary resources in hospitals in view of the expected

surge in Covid-19 cases.

The day-care centers will be started in the Super Speciality Hospital, and MTH, and five private hospitals for patients with low-risk and without

symptoms. He said that patients who are asymptomatic and who do not need external oxygen supply will be treated from the day-care center. These patients will be kept in

home isolation but they can have the necessary medicines and injections at the said centers. The day-care centers will have call centers to continuously monitor the condition of the patients on home isolation. The patients will be contacted twice a day to gather information about their condition.

The vaccination will be extended to all above 45 years of age from April 1. Collector Singh informed the meeting that free vaccination centers will be set up in every ward of the Indore district for implementing the vaccination campaign.

He said that people above 45 years of age will be able to visit these centers and get the Covid-19 vaccine. Along with this, the authorities will give permission to private hospitals to start mobile vaccination units.

## Club sealed for violating pandemic norms

The district administration has evacuated and sealed a club on Monday night over the alleged violation of the Covid-19 guidelines. A team of government officials and police personnel reached the Grand Machal Resort & Club on the instructions of District Collector Manish Singh. The team led by Tehsildar Bajrang Bahadur and Betma TI Sanjay Sharma evacuated the nearly 500 people partying in the club in alleged violation of the pandemic guidelines. They sealed the premises.

The administration is considering the filing of a criminal case against the club management.

TI Sanjay Sharma said that the team along with Tehsildar Bajrang Bahadur raided the Grand Machal Hotel Picnic Spot and Game Zone in Machal village of Betma area on Monday. Hundreds of people had gathered there ignoring the corona guideline. The people were not using the mask or maintaining social distancing.

Bahadur said the operation was launched after the officials received information about the violation of the pandemic guidelines at the facility.

Unidentified men reportedly opened fire outside a house of an employee of the Indore municipal corporation in Aerodrome police station jurisdiction late on Monday. According to police, old rivalry is stated to be the reason behind the incident. The identity of accused could not be ascertained till filing this report.

Aerodrome police station incharge Rahul Sharma said the incident took place in

family members of Chouhan panicked after hearing a bullet fire outside their house. The bullet reportedly hit the window of their house.

After opening fire, the miscreants fled the incident site.

Soon after the incident, the family members informed their neighbours and police about the incident. The CCTVs installed near the spot are being examined. According to a report, Chouhan is employed in Indore Municipal Corporation. His statements are being taken to know his rivalry with anyone.

Also, the CCTVs installed at the exit points have been checked to identify the accused.

## Chinkara horns seized at airport from passenger to Mumbai

The security officials of the Indore airport have seized a pair of horns of the chinkara deer from a Mumbai-bound passenger.

The security personnel of Devi Ahilya Bai Holkar International Airport handed over the passenger to the Aerodrome Police, who turned him over to the forest department for further interrogation.

AK Shrivastav, SDO of the Forest Department, said that he received information from the Aerodrome police station that a person was in possession of conjoined horns of chinkara without documentation. "He went to Ujjain to make a documentary and was returning to Mumbai," said Shrivastava, adding that the accused was detained at the airport and handed over to the Aerodrome police station.

The forest department was also probing the matter and ascertaining the genuineness of deer horn and, accordingly, action against the person concerned would be taken under



the Wildlife Act by presenting him in court. On the other hand, the traveller on being interrogated said that he had brought the horns to Indore in connection with the shooting and it was a duplicate.

According to a report, a seven-member team from Mumbai had come to Ujjain a few

days back in connection with the shoot of a documentary. On Monday, the team reached Indore Airport from Ujjain to fly to Mumbai. However, during the screening of the bag of a passenger, Kunal, who was a part of the team, the CISF personnel spotted a pair of chinkara horns in his baggage.



## Free masks, sanitizers distributed by Khajrana Temple committee
