# Use your vote to save democracy: Akhilesh

Says He Has No Faith In State Govt

"This govt is spoiling all institutions and ending the faith of people in them," Akhilesh said.

Talking to reporters after visiting Mukhtar's ancestral house in Yusufpur Mohammadabad area of Ghazipur district on Sunday afternoon, Akhilesh said, "To bring the truth of Mukhtar's death, I have been demanding a probe under the supervision of a sitting judge of the SC." Reacting over two probes started by state govt and district administration, Akhilesh made it very clear that he had no faith in govt.

Alleging that custodial deaths are on the rise under the present regime, which is discriminating against a section of the society, the SP

chief said that the govt failed to perform its responsibility of providing safety.

"I have mentioned all these facts in my speeches and even on the floor of the assembly and the govt didn't have any answers to them," said Akhilesh.

"In a democracy, the onus of ensuring justice is on the govt," he said, appealing to the people to use their power of voting to save the democracy. Mukhtar was lodged



in Banda jail when he suffered a cardiac arrest and died at a hospital in the same district on March 28.

Following his death, Mukhtar's family claimed that he had been poisoned inside the jail.

# Hoarding outside SP office calls for mourning of Mukhtar's death on Eid

Lucknow: A giant hoarding was put up outside Samajwadi Party's headquarters in Lucknow on Saturday morning, appealing to the people of the state not to celebrate Eid this year to mourn the death of former MLA Mukhtar Ansari.

The appeal was made in the name of "Samajwadis", but SP distanced itself from the move, with party leaders claiming they were not aware who placed the hoarding and when. The administration la-

Put up by Ram Sudhakar Yadav, former state secretary of SP's frontal organisation, Mulayam Singh Youth Brigade, the hoarding had a huge portrait of Ansari on one side and photographs of Akhilesh, party founder Mulayam Singh Yadav, its Muslim face Azam Khan and state president Naresh Uttam Patel, besides that of Ram Sudhakar himself. # Woman held for aiding cousin's elopement with juveniles in Azamgarh

Varanasi: A minor girl was held on Saturday for allegedly helping her teenage cousin elope with two juveniles in Azamgarh. Cops have also detained one of the two male juveniles in Mau while the search for the other one is underway.

According to police, a family member of the young woman filed a complaint on March 15. The FIR alleged that the two juveniles abducted the woman. The report further stated that the woman took Rs 30,000 and some ornaments with her. The arrested young woman's cousin is accused of aiding the elopement. Station officer Vipin Kumar Singh said that one of the juvenile delinquents was held in Mau. The woman's cousin was also arrested. The investigation is ongoing.

# Survey for Varanasi's digital twin city in full swing; aircraft, 4-wheelers deployed

Varanasi: The sight of low-flying aircraft in certain parts of Varanasi in the last few weeks has left residents curious about their purpose. These aircraft are engaged in conducting a 3D survey of the city, aimed at creating its urban spatial digital twin. Additionally, four-wheelers and pedestrian backpackers survey the narrow streets of the city for the same objective.

This survey has already covered more than 70 square kilometres of the area. D Vasudevan, chief general manager of Varanasi Smart City, said that the aerial survey is being carried out at an altitude of 3,800 feet using a dual-engine aircraft, the Partenavia P-68-C, operating from Lal Bahadur Shastri International Airport.

Equipped with a state-of-the-art Leica City Mapper 2S sensor and a camera capable of Light Detection and Ranging (LiDAR) and photogrammetry acquisition technology, this aircraft ensures precise and high-resolution mapping of Varanasi.

Furthermore, LiDAR surveys have been completed to cover a 360-degree vi-

ew of the city's 600 kilometres of roads, wards, and ghats, utilising four-wheeled vehicles and backpack

Vasudevan stated that this project aims to produce a digital 3D urban spatial twin map encompassing all the wards of Varanasi, covering a total area of 160 square kilometres.

This digital twin will be integrated into the Kashi Integrated Command and Control Centre (KICCC), enhancing the operational efficiency of various institutions, including Jal Kal, Varanasi Municipal Corporation, Varanasi Development Authority, and Jal Nigam, facilitating coordinated management of solid waste, fire, traffic, water

distribution, and sewerage systems. The project to develop the 3D urban spatial digital twin of Varanasi is expected to conclude within the next nine months. It is being executed by the Mumbai-based agency Genesis International Corporation.

Once completed, Varanasi will become the first city in the country to possess a digital twin of all its wards, building upon earlier pilot studies conducted in Jaipur.

The twin map will integrate more than 50 thematic layers of maps, detailing various infrastructure elements such as drains, water pipelines, street lights, toilets, drinking water facilities, and ward boundaries.

other departments for project implementation, resource development, and testing of tax collection systems.

Kaushal Raj Sharma, divisional commissioner and chairman of Varanasi Smart City, pointed out that previously only a 2D map covering an area of 84 square kilometres of the municipal corporation was available, causing inconvenience.

Varanasi Smart City now aims to create a modern digital twin map covering a 160 square kilometre area, enabling all civic agencies involved in the city management and administration to work in harmony.

Despite that, I feel that my family is not that proud of me. They want me to pursue research as my sister has done. Secondly, they're searching for arranged marriage prospects for me and the process is quite depressing. I get rejected several times and feel something is wrong with me. Thirdly, my mother, after recovering from a severe disease, gets anxious often. She says hurtful things and I start to palpitate. I cannot tell her anything as she will get more anxious. Please help me.**

aneously you need to speak positively about yourself, recognise and articulate your positive traits and be kind to your own self. You can start a positivity journal and must adopt a growth mindset. Rejection can be hard to deal with but concluding that something is wrong with you is an error in thinking and an unhealthy way of dealing with it. Do not take it personally. Accept and understand your emotions, avoid negative self-talk and reach out to your support system. Focus on your goals. It will be advisable to talk to your mother and share your feelings if she is saying something which hurts you. You can give her polite feedback. Believing that talking to her will make her anxious is an incorrect presumption.

**I have been in a relationship for the past four years, but never felt happy in it. However, I have already invested so much time and emotions that I feel stuck. I also have chronic health issues due to which I am scared to break up. I have a good friend who proposed to me for marriage as he knows I am not happy in my relationship but I took so much time to respond that his marriage got fixed and now it is too late. This looks like a difficult situation, but you must analyse it with objectivity. One can safely conclude that the relationship

is not working for you. Your health condition has created anxiety which seems to hold you back. Perhaps you have a low self-esteem which makes you insecure. The common reasons why we cannot get out of relationships which haven't worked include — investing too much time, fear of the unknown, fear of judgement and some perceived benefits of staying.
